

Collaborate with Learners


Collaborate with your learners to **co-design** questions with them.

Combine Question Types



A classroom with too many open questions can lack direction. Not having enough open questions will stunt inquiry and deeper understanding.

- Closed questions provide a foundation of skills and knowledge from which conceptual questions grow.
- Open questions are the soft expanding center surrounded by the crunchy closed question outer layer. Just like an Oreo!

Question Balance

There are so many ways to structure open and closed questions. Find the balance between them both for enriched learning.

- First step to deeper learing
- Create surface impression of topic
- Leads to specific details
- No exploration

Closed

- Limited depth
- Surface learning
- Answers easy to find
- Limited responses
- Close ended
 Summarize content
- Easy to recall and easy to forget

- Recall information Ends with the answer Sparks creativity Invites Wonder
 - Pause & think Open ended
 - Leads to conceptual understanding
 - Open Makes you say hmm
 - Leads to more questions
 - Makes you pause and think
 - Invites deeper thinking
 - Requires justification
 - No easy answer
 Can be revisited
 - Stirs curiosity/confusion
